

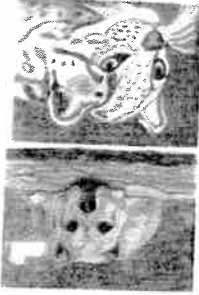
Dundurn Elementary School

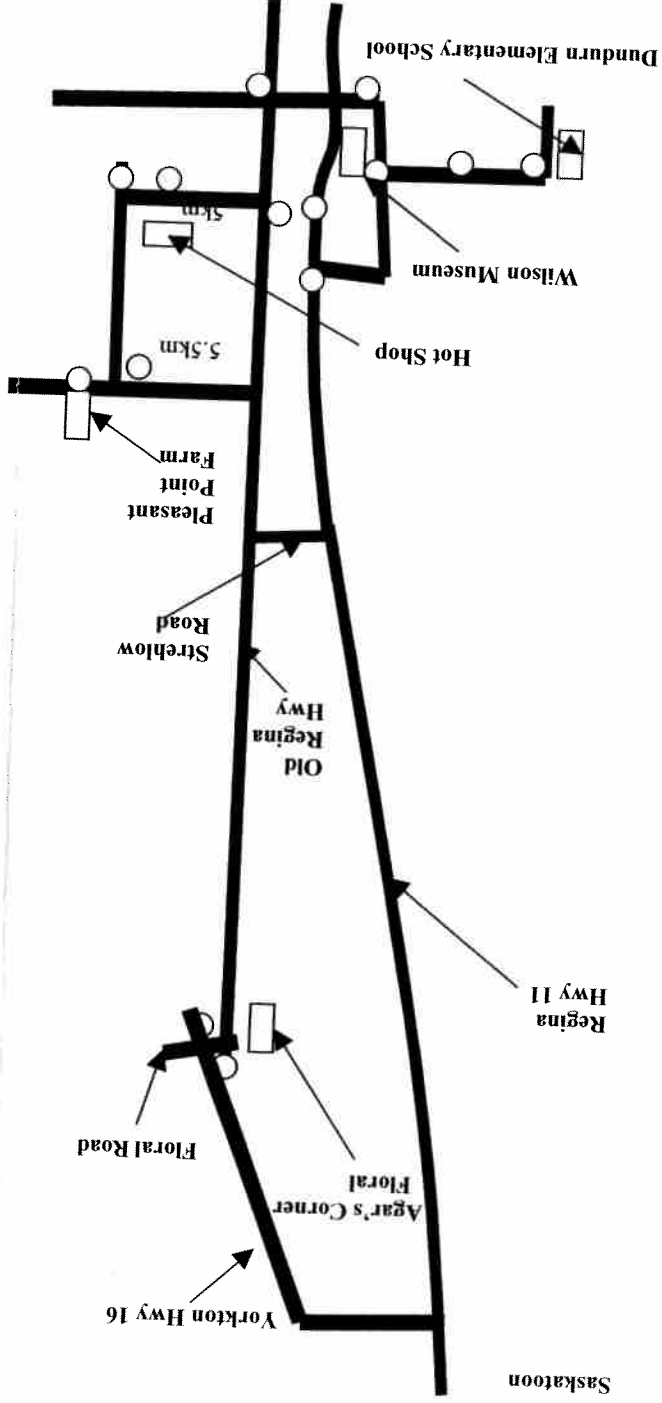

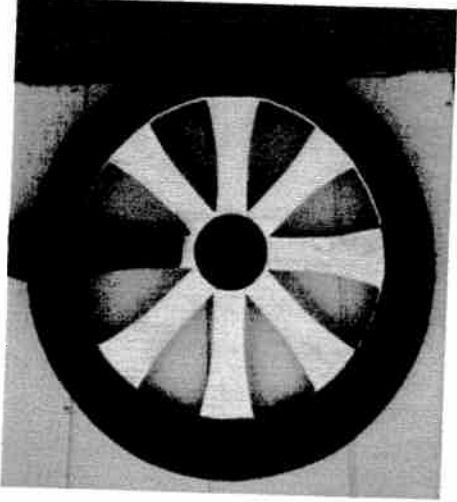
