February 2nd

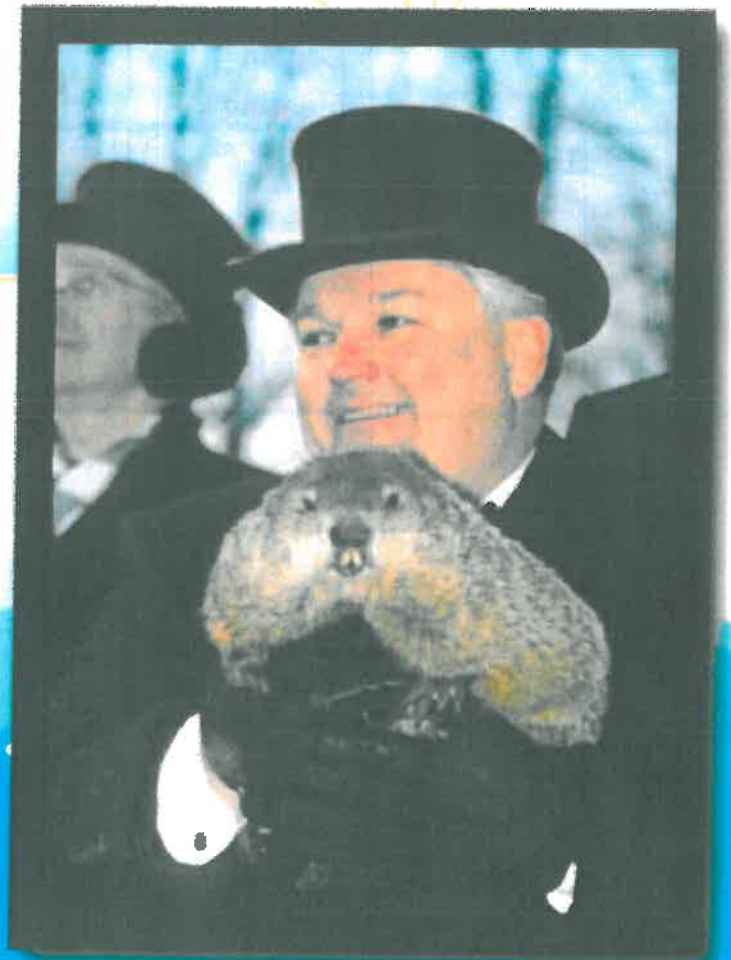
We would like to put Dundurn on the map to be the official Groundhog Day location for the Canadian west.

LANDFILL REMINDERS

- ❖ **Take Freon out of any appliances (fridges, freezers, air conditioners etc) before you take item to landfill**
- ❖ **Used oil will be accepted in 20 litre and under pails only. NO DRUMS unless you have a pump.**
- ❖ **Drop cell phones and other electronics including computers (e-waste) off at Sarcan 2327 Faithful Ave Saskatoon**
- ❖ **Please remove doors on fridges and freezers before you take item to landfill or if you are storing on your property for later disposal. Children playing can become trapped.**
- ❖ **No tires (auto or tractor)**
- ❖ **Regular household garbage - 1 pc or 1 bag up to ½ ton truck box will cost you \$10.00 to dump in the town red bin. Red bin garbage higher than your regular truck box will cost you \$20.00.**
- ❖ **Barbeque tanks, appliances and other metal - FREE to dump**
(remove freon from appliances or they may be rejected at site)
- ❖ **Flourescent light fixtures - \$5.00**
- ❖ **Regular couch - \$10.00**
- ❖ **Pull out couch - \$20.00**
- ❖ **Chair - \$10.00**
- ❖ **Single mattress - \$5.00**
- ❖ **Double, Queen, King Mattress- \$10.00**
- ❖ **Shingles - \$100.00 per ½ ton**
- ❖ **Regular household garbage -\$10.00 min up to ½ ton or -\$20.00 over truck box**

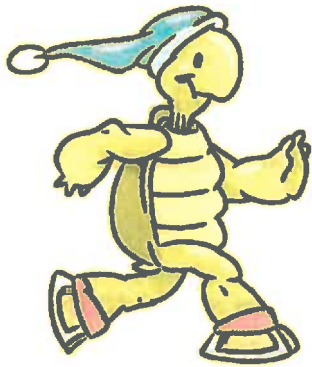

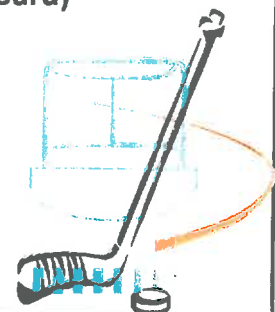

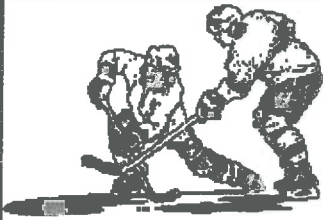

Town News:

Most of you have noticed a new building going up at the far east end of 2nd Street. A combined effort by the Town and RM has been able to put up a much needed addition for our Fire Hall. This will be able to alleviate some of the congestion at the existing Fire Hall by providing more space for the equipment. A fund-raising effort continues, however, for a new Fire Hall in the near future as this will only suffice as a temporary fix.

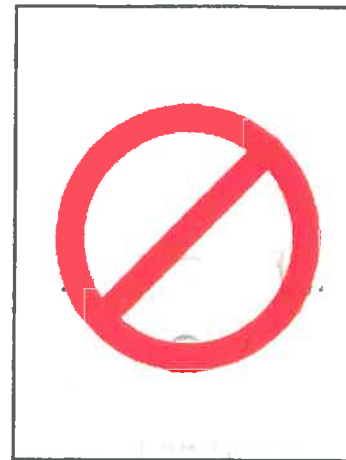
Council has decided to go back to two meetings a month starting in January. They will be held on the first and third Mondays of each month. If the Monday is a stat holiday (or follows a stat that falls on a weekend) then the meeting will automatically fall onto the following Tuesday. Our first meeting of 2012 will be held on January 3 to accommodate the stat holiday.

You will notice a new piece of equipment on our streets this winter. The Town has purchased a sand/salt spreader to help cut down maintenance costs and serve our community better.

We expect to see our residents have city water sometime in January. A letter was sent out to our subscribers explaining that Council chose to hold off until we could deliver 100% "city" water as opposed to running a blend.

Take Care of Our Utility Systems!!!!

Everyone knows of someone who has accidentally flushed something they shouldn't have down the toilet and amazingly nothing broke! However, the story doesn't usually end there. Once the item is safely out of your home system it travels into the municipal system where it possibly may cause a blockage with some not so nice results for your neighbor. This is why the Town of Dundurn is asking for your cooperation in keeping items that are not meant for the sewage system, out of the sewage system. Please refrain from sending these items down the drain:



- **Feminine products**
- **Diapers**
- **Grease & Oils**
- **Paints & solvents**
- **Paper towels**
- **"disposable" wipes**

All of these items can prove hazardous to our sewer systems and result in costly repair bills both on our mains and in your homes should a back up occur.

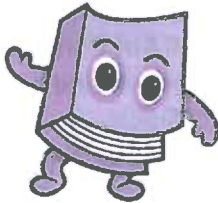

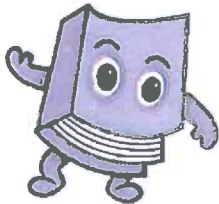
