- 1. Zero tolerance for verbal or physical abuse.
- 2. Skate at your own risk.
- 3. This is an unsupervised facility, anyone under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4. Anyone under the age of 18 must wear a helmet.
- 5. On public skating days, allowance for sticks on ice is limited to the far end.
- 6. Read and abide by all posted signs, warnings and cooperate with staff.
- 7. No sitting on counters, or tabletops.
- 8. Always maintain reasonable control of your speed and course, know your skating ability and skate within your limits.
- 9. Maintain a proper skating distance to lookout and avoid other skaters, objects, or conditions on the surface of the rink. You must refrain from acting in a manner that may cause or contribute to injury to yourself or others.
- 10. No pushing or reckless skating.
- 11. No alcoholic beverages are permitted on the ice.
- 12. No smoking permitted anywhere inside Dundurn rink.
- 13. Do not skate while under the influence of drugs, alcohol or other control impairing substances.
- 14. We promote clean, fun, friendly and safe behavior for our guests/customers; inconsiderate behavior by guests/customers will not be tolerated.
- 15. We reserve the right to refuse admission to anyone not meeting the standards of good behavior and to evict persons not following the policies of this facility.
- 16. Leave the ice surface when resurfacing or maintenance is taking place.

Skaters understand the assumption of risk agreement; by engaging in skating, skaters are deemed to have knowledge of, and assume the inherent risks of skating, which include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Injuries that result from collisions or contact with other skaters or other individuals who are on the skating surface.
- 2. Injuries that result from falls.
- 3. Injuries that involve objects or artificial structures that are property within the intended path of travel of the skater.

Spectators understand the assumption of risk:

1. Spectators understand and shall comply with each posted sign or warning and assume the inherent risks related to a skating rink.
