Town Updates

Sunshine Meadows

I am excited to see increased building activity in Sunshine Meadows. You may have noticed three new single-family homes, and a six-unit multi-unit building (rental) take shape over the last 9 months. There are plans for additional units over the next 12 months and we are working collaboratively with the Developer to explore further residential and commercial opportunities.

Fire and Protective Services Updates

The Dundurn and District Fire Commission provides fire and first-responder services to our region. Over the past 3 months, the department has acquired a new to us tanker truck to help support fire calls and shuttle water. We are lucky to have this great team of volunteers serving our rate payers and visitors.

The Town has recently approved the 2025 Fire Budget and updated our fire bylaws to modern standards in line with our neighbouring municipalities. Effective July 1, 2025, each property owner will be responsible for paying the cost of any fire fighting efforts at their property, switching from the Town being responsible. You will need to speak with your property insurer to update your policy to provide coverage for these costs. Stay tuned for more information and feel free to contact the office with any questions.

2025 Budget and Tax Tools

Council deliberated and approved the 2025 Operating and Capital Budgets. This budget builds on last years action plan and continues to provide funding toward the implementation of Council's strategic priorities.

One of the major changes revolves around the taxation strategy. We opted to switch from minimum to base taxes to create a more equitable and balanced property tax regime. This allows for the common costs of services to be equitably distributed and a lower mill rate to factor in the value of the property.

First Rate Payer Open House

We held our first open house for rate payers. This activity promotes transparency and access to Council and was not only identified in our strategic plan but was heard loud and clear on the campaign trail. Being open and transparent is key for this Council and we will continue activities and others as opportunities present themselves. We encourage you to make your voice heard and we look forward to listening.
